


TO ALL AND SILENTS WHOIN THESE PRESENTS DO OR MAY CONCERN.

WE, Malcolm Rossdale Innes of Edingight, Baron of Yeochrie, Commander of the Royal Victorian Order; Master to Her Majesty's Signet, Lord Lyon King of Arms, send Greeting: Whereas Sheila Anne McGregor, Chairman, and James Brown Gregor MacAdam, Secretary, having by Petition unto Us of date 25 February 1983 for and on behalf of

## THE CLAN GREGOR SOCIETY

shewen: That the said Society has its office at 14 Lockharton Avenue in the City of Edinburgh; That the said Society was established on 13 December 1822 and has functioned as a Clan society ever since; That the said Society has for its objects the following. (a) to assist in the education of young persons being sons or daughters of parents belonging to the Clan Gregor. (b) to assist deserving persons of the Clan Gregor by giving aid in cases of exceptional necessity, (c) to encourage the publication of ancient or interesting documents, or articles, or interesting events connected with the Clan, and the compilation of an authentic history of the Clan and the different families belonging to it, (d) to encourage Clan feeling by promoting gatherings and social meetings from time to time, (e) to encourage and assist overseas members of the Clan Gregor and of affiliated organisations visiting Scotland, and similarly to assist members of the Society to contact clansmen or affiliated organisations abroad, (f) to preserve or assist in preserving buildings, monuments, memorials or articles of any kind connected with the Clan or its members, and (g) to establish a permanent centre for the preservation of such articles and a focal point for the meeting of members of the Clan: And the Petitioners having prayed that there might be granted unto them such Ensigns Armorial as might be found suitable and according to the Laws of Arms. Know Ye: Therefore that We have Devised and Do by these Presents Assign, Ratify and Confirm unto the Petitioners for and on behalf of the Clan Gregor Society the following Ensign Armorial, as depicted upon the margin hereof, and matriculated of even date with these Presents upon the 10<sup>th</sup> day of the 62<sup>nd</sup> Volume of our Public Register of All Arms and Bearings in Scotland, videlicet: Argent. a sword in bend Dexter Azure hilted and pommelled Or and a pine tree eradicated in bend sinister Proper. the former supporting on its point in dexter chief canton an antique crown Gules. In chief two annulets interlaced Azure and in base an open book expanded Or binding and fore-edges Sable. Above the Shield is placed an Helm suitable to an incorporation (viz. a Salade Proper lined Gules) with a Mantling Azure doubled Argent. and on a Wreath of the

Livery is set for Crest a lion's head erased Or gorged of a chain Azure and crowned of an antique crown Gules, and in an Escrol over the same this Motto  
 ROYAL IS OUR RACE, by remonstration of which Ensigns Armorial the said Society is, amongst all Nobles and in all Places of Honour, to be taken, numbered, accounted and treated as an Incorporation Noble in the Noblesse of Scotland: In Testimony Whereof We have Subscribed these Presents and the Seal of Our Office is affixed hereto at Edinburgh this 21<sup>st</sup> day of January in the 33<sup>rd</sup> Year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lady Elizabeth the Second, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and of Her other Realms and Territories. Queen. Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith, and in the year of Our Lord one Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty Five.
